Message from our Menahel

In the beginning of this week's אברם, לך לך פרשת יה, is instructed by 'ה: אל הארץ אשר "לך לך "ב, א' אברם לך לך "ב, א') אראך" (פרק י"ב, א')

Rashi comments from a מדרש רבה that 'a did not reveal to אברם his final destination in order to endear the מצוה in his eyes (by making it more difficult) and to reward him for each step that he took. The Steipler Gaon, זצ"ל, points out that from the first reason, to endear the mitzvah in אברם אברם eyes, we learn that when a person works hard to attain something over a period of time, it has a much greater value to him. In contrast, if something is easily attained without much effort, he will not treat it the same way. The Steipler applies this to our לימוד The person who is a ירא שמים and puts in effort to understand חורה and perseveres until he succeeds will have greater סיפוק הנפש and he will remember his learning.

It is a crucial lesson to instill in our children: Yes, learning can be and should be challenging but we must persist in order to succeed in our לימוד התורה. It is by helping our children rise up to the challenges they encounter when learning that we will help to endear the mitzvah of לימוד התורה to them.

May 'ה grant us the סייעתא דשמיא to help our children grow and accomplish in their לימוד התורה.
