In this week's parsha, פרשת יתרו, the תורה tells us that after מתן ~Rabbi and Mrs. Simcha Perlowitz הר סיני could ascend כלל ישראל.

"....במשך היבל המה יעלו בהר...."

Rav Moshe Shternbuch, שליט", wonders that after such a singular event in world history, מתן תורה, when 'a revealed ~ Mr. and Mrs. Moshe Hoschan-Himself to כלל ישראל for the purpose of giving us the תורה, one would assume that הר סיני would remain infused with הדושה forever. Yet we see that when the שכינה departed, הר סיני reverted back to its mundane non-קדושה status that allowed even animals to walk on it.

One could argue that after the infusion of this abundant amount of הר סיני, קדושה should certainly retain some of the קדושה forever.

Ray Shternbuch explains that even being designated as the site of מתן תורה does not inherently grant you eternal קדושה ~ Avrohom Leib Jurkowitz on his . It is only through מידות טובות and קיום המצות, לימוד התורה Bar Mitzvah. that eternal קדושה is achieved. This is the very reason that today the מקום המקדש. It was a place where there was incredible קיום המצות and לימוד התורה. It is a concept that we could apply to our בתי מדרשות and בתי מדרשות even in לארץ. Even though we lack the בית המקדש, we can infuse our yeshiva and shul with קדושה by learning and davening in them.

This message is crucial for our children to grasp. We must teach them that our לימוד התורה and קיום המצות are the manner in which we infuse קדושה into our surroundings. A main purpose of our existence is to bring קדושה into the world around us by doing the 'ה רצון ה. May we continue to transmit this beautiful message to our families and to infuse our sur-משיח צדקינו במהרה until the arrival of קדושה בימינו אמן.
